Identification

Zebra mussels are small shellfish named for the striped pattern of their shells. Color patterns can vary

to the point of having only dark or light colored shells and no stripes. They are typically found attached to objects, surfaces, or each other by threads underneath the shells.

Zebra mussels foul beaches, interfere with food webs, smother native mussels, clog water intakes, and are linked to fish and wildlife die-offs. Zebra mussels filter plankton from the surrounding water. Each mussel can filter about one quart of lake water per day. However, not all of what they remove is eaten. What they don't eat is combined with mucus as "pseudofeces" and discharged onto the lake bottom where it accumulates.

It is important to remove visible zebra mussels and aquatic plants and drain water before transporting boats and equipment from one water body to another. Report suspected new infestations to the [Minnesota Invasive Species Advisory Council](http://www.mn.gov/InvasiveSpecies).
